Jeff Olson, long time & very successful football coach at Ishpeming High School, will be our guest speaker at the 2019 All-Star Banquet.

Jeff was born in Marquette & participated in athletics at Marquette high where he was recognized as an All U.P. selection in both football & basketball. He furthered his education at NMU & earned a Bachelor's degree in Business Management in 1985 & followed with a teaching certificate in Physical Education in 1987. Besides his 22 years of teaching at Ishpeming, he has also taught at Marquette, Gwinn, & Sault Ste. Marie schools.

Jeff Olson has established a coaching career that can only be described as "remarkable". In addition to his legendary status as the Ishpeming football coach, he has also coached basketball for 30 years & track for 15 years. He has coached football for 37 years while being at the helm of the Ishpeming program for the past 27 seasons. The accomplishments that he & his Hematites have earned during his tenure are mind boggling. This impressive list includes more than 200 victories, several conference, District, & Regional championships, U.P. teams of the year recognition, 17 MHSAA playoff appearances that resulted in his Hematites playing every game possible for 5 different seasons: State Finalists in 2010 & 2014 and bringing the State Championship trophies across the Bridge in 2012, 2013, & 2015. Throughout Jeff's coaching career he has earned just about every kind of recognition that can be awarded to a high school football coach ranging from Conference, Regional, U.P., Detroit News, Associated Press, & the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association where he was selected as the Division 7 State Coach of the Year 4 times. In 2016 he was inducted into the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame, & last year he received recognition as the Detroit Lions Coach of the week which earned him & his wife Sally another trip to Ford Field (which I'm sure was a lot less stressful than the other trips).

His love & desire for the game of football has also influenced many other players & coaches within the U.P. & State of Michigan as a result of his willingness to coach All-Star games. Just last week he was downstate coaching in the East-West All Star football game in Saginaw & this week he participated in coaching his 7<sup>th</sup> U.P. Football All Star Game.

Jeff's family includes his wife of 28 years (Sally), sons Daniel, Taylor, & Isaac, & daughter Jamie.

Lastly, being the former football coach that I am, I decided to do a little "scouting report" about Jeff & try to find out things about him that probably never appeared in the media.
